The School Report Card as mandated by the No Child Left Behind legislation will be available online Thursday, October 29 at 10:00AM at www.ncreportcards.org. A hard copy will be sent home next week in the Wednesday folder. The information about technology is incorrect, we had 100% connectivity and our Students with Disabilities percentage is in the high 20% range. Please note that the information is about last year not this year; it is for school year 2008-2009.
